He served as executive director of the New York City Districting Commission.

Hum was also Special Counsel for Intergovernmental Affairs & Deputy General Counsel at the NYC Department of Small Business Services, where he chaired a transition team that successfully merged the former Department of Employment with the Department of Small Business Services.

Earlier in his career, Hum was appointed Assistant District Attorney for the New York County District Attorney's Office where he prosecuted and tried felony cases, counseled police investigations and served with the Domestic Violence Unit. Hum holds a BA from [Wesleyan University of Connecticut](#), and a JD from [Fordham University School of Law](#).
